# ABOUT ZECHARIAH

- This Zechariah is not the OT prophet by the same name. This Zechariah was a priest in Jerusalem during the time of Christ's birth.
- He and his wife, Elizabeth, were old, barren and could not have a child.
- When the angel told them that they would give birth to a son, Zechariah didn't believe. God punished him by taking away his speech.
- The angel told Zechariah to name the baby, John (the Baptist).
- When they had baby John circumcised, God restored Zechariah's speech.
- Zechariah the priest was steeped in OT scriptures.
- Zechariah's message was basically twofold:
  - A. The Messiah was on His way.
  - B. The long wait will soon be over.

## ABOUT ZECHARIAH'S SONG

"Blessed *be* the Lord God of Israel for He has visited..." - v. 68 (NASB)

## Now, Zechariah gives five truths about this Divine Visitation:

#### 1. It's Saving Purpose

**Luke 1:67–68, NLT** - <sup>67</sup> Then his father, Zechariah, was filled with the Holy Spirit and gave this prophecy: <sup>68</sup> "Praise the Lord, the God of Israel, because He has visited and redeemed his people....

#### 2. It's Predicted Fulfillment

**Luke 1:70–73, NLT** -<sup>70</sup> just as <u>He promised through His holy prophets</u> <u>long ago</u>. <sup>71</sup> Now we will be saved from our enemies and from all who hate us. <sup>72</sup> He has been <u>merciful to our ancestors by remembering His</u> <u>sacred covenant</u>— <sup>73</sup> the <u>covenant He swore with an oath</u> to our ancestor Abraham.

### 3. It's Transforming Enablement

**Luke 1:74–75, NLT** -<sup>74</sup> We have been rescued from our enemies so we can serve God without fear, <sup>75</sup> in holiness and righteousness for as long as we live.

#### 4. It's Prepared Forerunner

**Luke 1:75–77, NLT** -<sup>75</sup> in holiness and righteousness for as long as we live. <sup>76</sup> And you, <u>my little son</u>, will be called the prophet of the Most High, because <u>you will prepare the way for the Lord</u>. <sup>77</sup> You will tell His people how to find salvation through forgiveness of their sins.

#### 5. It's Liberating Impact

**Luke 1:78–79, NLT** -<sup>78</sup> Because of God's tender mercy, <u>the morning light</u> from heaven is about to break upon us, <sup>79</sup> to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, and to guide us to the path of peace."
