## Continue to Live

## 1. Throw off (the deeds of darkness).

Romans 13:12–13, HCSB - 12 The night is nearly over, and the daylight is near [it's all going to end soon], so let us discard [lit., throw off, forsake] the deeds of darkness and put on the armor [which is made for warfare] of light. 13 Let us walk with decency, [lit., "behave properly" and live in a way that pleases God] as in the daylight: not in carousing [a reference to a Roman athletic victory celebration (orgy)] and drunkenness [intentional and habitual intoxication]; not in sexual impurity [has the basic meaning of shameless acts with no restraints] and promiscuity [Gk: κοίτη, (COY-ta) a basic term for "bed", re-coined by NT writers in the first century, that refers to the 'marriage bed' (cf., Heb. 13:4) that refers to sexual acts outside of biblical marriage]; not in quarreling [also translated "strife", it refers to persistent contention, bickering, petty disagreements, not resolving disagreements biblically] and jealousy [selfishness—specifically tearing others down to feel better about yourself].

## 2. Put on (the armor of Light).

Romans 13:12, HCSB - <sup>12</sup> The night is nearly over, and the daylight is near ["I can't think of a verse that offers more hope than this one" -JKTJ, so let us discard the deeds of darkness and put on [present tense—keep putting on Jesus] the armor of light... <sup>14</sup> But put on [the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no plans to satisfy [translate the one Gk. word, pronoia, that has the basic meaning of forethought or pre-planning against an adversary] the fleshly [ie., evil] desires.

Thy all this stress on behavior? Because, as I think you have realized the present time is of the highest importance—it is time to wake up to reality. Every day brings God's salvation nearer than the day in which we took the first step of faith. The night is nearly over, the day has almost dawned. Let us therefore fling away the things that men do in the dark, let us arm ourselves for the fight of the day! Let us live cleanly, as in the daylight, not in the delights of getting drunk or playing with sex. Not yet in quarrelling or jealousies. Let us be Christ's men from head to foot, and give no chances to the flesh to have its fling.

WORD STUDY

The English word, **SIN**, comes from the Old English, *syngian*, meaning "to trespass"; in Latin, *syns* means "guilty", it

derives from the Hebrew word, κιρη (khaw-taw) meaning, "to miss the mark"; it also comes from the Greek word, ἀμαρτία (hamartēma), meaning "to fail in duty."
