- 2 Peter 1.1 (PME)

1. This faith is in a person (vv. 1-2)

STUDY VSERSE SECTION - 2 Peter 1:1–2, NASB95 - 1 Simon Peter, a

<u>bond-servant</u> [the Gk. word, doulos, can be translated "slave"—it pictures unconditional surrender] and apostle of Jesus Christ, To those who have <u>received</u> [this word implies a gift that was received] a faith of the same kind as ours, by the righteousness of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ: ² Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord;

2 Peter 1:1–2, JBP - Simon Peter, a servant and messenger of Jesus Christ, sends this letter to all who treasure the same faith in Jesus Christ as do we and who value this faith as ours given in the righteousness of our God, and savior Jesus Christ. May you know more and more of grace and peace as your knowledge of God and Jesus our Lord grows deeper.

- The foundation of our faith is the apostolic witness to Jesus Christ.
- The beginning of our faith is when we receive faith of the same kind as the apostles.
- The source and object of our faith is Jesus Christ.
- The blessing of our faith is knowing Christ more and more.

2. This faith requires God's Power.

STUDY VERSE SECTION - 2 Peter 1:3, NASB95 - ³ seeing that His divine <u>power</u> [Gk: δύναμίς, gives us our word *dynamite*; here in the genitive case—the Source of this power is supernatural in nature] has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the <u>true knowledge</u> [Gk: ἐπιγνώσεως, Ερί (upon) and gnosis (knowledge)] of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

2 Peter 1:3, NLT - ³ By His divine power, God has given us everything we need for living a godly life. We have received all of this by coming to know him, the one who called us to himself by means of <u>His marvelous glory and excellence</u>.

3. This faith involves God's promises.

STUDY VERSE SECTION - 2 Peter 1:4, NASB95 - 4 For by these He has granted to us His precious and <u>magnificent</u> [eg., remarkable, costly, valuable and priceless] promises, so that by them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust.

The Primary Promises of 2 Peter

The faith that saves is God's gift to us
The forgiveness of all our sins—past, present, and future
The spiritual adoption provided by God the Father
The spiritual strength given by the Holy Spirit
The comfort of God through suffering and hardship
The provision of all our needs
The sufficiency of His Holy Word
The hope of Heaven when we die
The bodily resurrection when He returns

4. This faith is built on God's Precious Word.

2 Peter 1:12, NLT - ¹² Therefore, I will always remind you about these things—even though you already know them and are <u>standing firm in</u> the truth you have been taught.
