- 1. The Church at Rome, much like the church today, had many different people with different levels of faith, personalities, issues, and convictions.
- 2. We are called to **Accept One Another** because God accepts, sustains, and is Lord and judge over us all.
- 3. At the "Judgment Seat of Christ," Christ will reward believers for what they have done for God on earth (rewards); at the "Great White Throne Judgment," unbelievers will be judged for never making Christ Lord (punishment).
- 4. Some things matter and some things really don't matter.

Handling Each Other with Care

1. Don't harm your fellow believer.

Romans 14:13–15, HCSB - ¹³ Therefore, [because we are a church with those strong in their faith, and those weak in their faith] let us no longer criticize [lit., judge] one another. Instead decide never to put a stumbling block or pitfall [Gk: σκάνδαλον (SCAN-da-lon) from which we get our English word, scandal, it lit. refers to the triggering mechanism on a baited animal trap—it catches an animal off-guard and kills it] in your brother's way. ¹⁴ (I know and am persuaded by the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself. Still, to someone who considers a thing to be unclean, to that one it is unclean.) ¹⁵ For if your brother is hurt by what you eat, you are no longer walking according to love. Do not [lit., "utterly"] destroy that one Christ died for by what you eat.

Romans 14:13, TLB - 13 So don't criticize each other anymore. <u>Try</u> instead to live in such a way that you will never make your brother <u>stumble</u> by letting him see you doing something he thinks is wrong.

2. Don't harm your testimony.

Romans 14:16–18, HCSB - ¹⁶ Therefore, <u>do not let your good</u> [works and reputation] <u>be slandered</u> [Gk: βλασφημέω (blas-pha-ME-o) lit., blasphemed], ¹⁷ for <u>the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit*</u>. ¹⁸ Whoever serves Christ in this way is acceptable to God and approved by men.

* Here's what the world ought to see in us:

- Righteousness God's declaration over you; holiness.
- Peace Spiritual calmness, inner core of unflappability, undisturbed by minor irritations of the moment.
- Joy A spiritual and eternal perspective on the circumstances of life.

Romans 14:16–18, TLB - ¹⁶ Don't do anything that will cause criticism against yourself even though you know that what you do is right. ¹⁷ For, after all, the important thing for us as Christians is not what we eat or drink but stirring up goodness and peace and joy from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁸ If you let Christ be Lord in these affairs, God will be glad; and so will others.

3. Don't harm your church.

Romans 14:19–23, HCSB - ¹⁹ So then, we must pursue what promotes peace and what builds up one another. ²⁰ Do not tear down God's work because of food. Everything is clean, but it is wrong for a man to cause stumbling by what he eats. ²¹ It is a noble thing not to eat meat, or drink wine, or do anything that makes your brother stumble. ²² Do you have a conviction? Keep it to yourself before God. [Lit., "If you have faith, keep it between you and God"] The man who does not condemn himself by what he approves is blessed. ²³ But whoever doubts stands condemned if he eats, because his eating is not from a conviction, and everything that is not from a conviction is sin.



The Believer is to live in a manner that promotes harmony and builds up other members of faith.

Life Application Section

Will you be a <u>stepping stone</u> or a <u>stumbling block</u> for God?

- A. Do not deliberately cause a brother or sister in Christ to stumble.
- B. Give up your "freedom" when it threatens the peace or hinders the growth of another believer.
- C. Never act from doubt—only from conviction!
