STUDY SECTION

THE STATUE IN NEBUCHADNEZZAR'S DREAM

Daniel 2:32–34, NASB95 - ³² "The head of that statue was made of <u>fine gold</u>, its breast and its arms of <u>silver</u>, its belly and its thighs of <u>bronze</u>, ³³ its legs of <u>iron</u>, its feet partly of iron and partly of clay. ³⁴ "You continued looking until a stone was cut out without hands, and it struck the statue on its feet of iron and clay and crushed them.

A HISTORY OF WORLD POWERS

1. The HEAD was made of fine _____.

Gold represented King Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian Empire. Dates: 605-539 BC. Scripture: Daniel 3:32, 36-38. Metal: Nebo built with gold.

2. The CHEST and ARMS were made of

Silver represented Cyrus the Great, of the Medo-Persian Empire, who

conquered the Babylonians just outside modern Baghdad. Daniel was still alive. This kingdom lasted almost 200 years. Israel flourished during this time. Date: 539-331 BC. Scripture: Daniel 2:39a. Metal: The Persians required all nations to bring an offering to their gods—paid only in silver.

3. The BELLY and THIGHS were made of _____

BRONZE represented the Grecian Empire, known most for a leader named Alexander the Great who finally destroyed the Persian Empire. Historians said Alexander "wept" when he realized there were no more kingdoms to conquer. Dates: 331-63 BC. Scripture: Daniel 2:39b. Metal: Greek armies used bronze in their shields, helmets, and weapons.

4. The LEGS were made of ...

Iron represented the Roman Empire whose army rumbled across the Mediterranean world like iron tanks and crushed everything in its path. A fact about this part of the statue (legs) may symbolize the division of the Romans Empire into East and West. Date: 63BC-approx 400 AD). Scriptures: Daniel 2:40 (and poss. vv. 41ff). Metal: Romans armies strengthened their weapons by using iron. Thought: The Romans were never conquered—they crumbled from within. (Why did they fall?)

5. The TOES were made of _____ and ____

<u>Iron and Clay</u> (Roman Civilization influencing "many nations") may represent the 10 league of nations or the *numerous nations* of today—the day in which we live. Date: 400AD to present. Scriptures: Dan. 2:42-43).

6. A came and crushed the statue.

<u>The Stone</u>, "cut out without hands," came from the sky and destroyed the statue. It hit the feet and toes and the statue crumbled. The Stone represents Jesus coming again to the earth to end this life as we know it.
