### Review

- 1. Suffering is part of living in a "fallen world," is unrelated to our own personal goodness, and amplifies God's message that we need a Savior.
- 2. Two key biblical passages for suffering are James 1:2-5 (there is a definiteness, indefiniteness about our trials) and Romans 8:28 (there is something confidential, comprehensive, constructive and conditional) about sufferings.

#### STUDY SECTION

To Receive God's Grace in our Sufferings, We Must:

1. Maintain a passion for "God's Good Thing."

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 3:13, NASB95** - <sup>13</sup> Who is there to <u>harm</u> [lit., distress] you if you <u>prove</u> [lit., become] <u>Zealous</u> [Gk: zēlōtēs, in means "intensity"] for what is good [Gk. agathos, lit. "God's good (thing)"]?

# 2. Maintain a willingness to suffer.

STUDY VERSE SECTION 1 Peter 3:14, 17, NASB95 - 14 But even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, you are <u>blessed</u> [ie., it denotes privilege, not effect]. AND DO NOT FEAR THEIR INTIMIDATION, AND DO NOT BE <u>TROUBLED</u> [lit., "not be shaken"]... 17 For it is better, <u>if God should will it so</u>, that you suffer for doing what is right rather than for doing what is wrong.

## 3. Maintain a devotion to Christ.

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 3:15, NASB95** - <sup>15</sup> but <u>sanctify</u> [Gk: hagioazo, hagi means to "burn" (as on an altar); oazo, lit., "to chain," it paints a picture of surrender; it means "to set apart as holy"] Christ as Lord in your hearts...

Our enemies or circumstances might *hurt* us, but they cannot *harm* us. Only we can harm ourselves if we fail to surrender to Christ as Lord. IMPORTANT: *Surrendering fully to Christ is the battle of every heart.* 

## 4. Maintain a readiness to defend the faith.

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 3:15, NASB95** - <sup>15</sup> but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a defense [Gk: apologia gives us our word "apology;" it doesn't mean saying "I'm sorry;" it is a legal term, it is a formal defense in a judicial courtroom on a matter] to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence [Note: We are witnesses, not prosecuting attorneys! Our purpose is not to win an argument, but to win lost souls to Christ]...

## 5. Maintain a pure conscience.

STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 3:16, NASB95 - 16 and keep a good


<u>COnscience</u> [con means "with;" scio means "to know..." or "to prove" via a standard (i.e., God's Holy Word); our conscience, when guided by God's Word, is that internal judge that witnesses to us about "God's Good Thing"] so that in the thing in which you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ will be put to shame.

# An Insight about "sanctifying Christ as Lord of your heart"

**2 Corinthians 2:14, NIV84** - <sup>14</sup> But thanks be to God, who always <u>leads us in triumphal procession in Christ</u> and through us spreads everywhere the fragrance of the knowledge of him.



**2 Corinthians 2:14, NLT** - <sup>14</sup> But thank God! He has made us <u>his captives and continues to lead us along in Christ's triumphal procession</u>. Now he uses us to spread the knowledge of Christ everywhere, like a sweet perfume.
