☀ Study Verse Section – Philippians 1:15-20

STUDY VERSE SECTION - Philippians 1:21, NASB ⁻²¹ *For to me [It's used here in the emphatic tense—this is personal to Paul], to live [lit., the act living] is [this Greek sentence, v. 21, actually contains no verb; there is no "is" in this sentence] Christ and to die [lit., to have died; cf., natural death; there is a difference between dying and death, right?] is gain [denotes a 'great gain' like our concept of a large inheritance].*

Literal Translation: *To me! To live—Christ; do die—gain!*

Philippians 1:21, GWT ⁻²¹ *For to me, will it be life or death? It's either living for Christ or with Christ. Either way, I can't lose.* (Underlines added for emphasis.)

A. They can't rob you of joy.

"I rejoice, yes, and I will rejoice" - v. 18

B. They can't take everything from you.

"To me, to live—Christ; do die—gain." - v. 21 (literal trans.)

C. They can't separate you from your inheritance.

"For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." - 21, NIV

How death can become 'Gain'?

1. We lose everything we don't need. (World, flesh, evil, doubt, trials)
 2. We keep everything that matters. (Soul, faith, saved loved-ones)
 3. We gain what we never had. (Heaven, new bodies, God, Jesus, HS)
