# **What Makes Jesus Marvel?**

It seems there are two things that make Jesus step back and say, "Wow!"

- 1. Those who believe when it's not expected they would.
- 2. Those who disbelieve when there's every reason they should.

# The Consequences of Unbelief

## 1. The Limiting of Christ

Mark 6:5, NASB95 - And <u>He could do no miracle there</u>\* [Genitive Case (not accusative) indicating a "moral decision"] except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them.

\*This statement does not mean that the people's unbelief limits the power of Christ; it means it limits the blessings from Christ.

**Matthew 13:58, ESV** - And he did not do many mighty works there, because of their unbelief. [NOT because of His lack of power.]

# 2. The Loathing of Christ.

Mark 6:6a, ESV – <sup>6a</sup> And <u>He marveled\*\* because of their unbelief.</u>



"Marveled" [Gk: θαυμάζω (thaumázō) lit., to behold with energy; here in Mark 6:6, it's an *imperfect* verb (rather than a *perfect* verb). A perfect tense verb would communicate a positive response; this imperfect tense communicates a negative *marveling*.

Mark 6:6, YLT - 6 ... and he loathed their unbelief.

Mark 6:6, TLB - And he could hardly accept the fact that they wouldn't believe in him.

The people of Nazareth were shocked by His preaching, stumbled over His person, snubbed His power and were shocking in their unbelief. – Dr. Alan Carr

## 3. The Leaving of Christ.

Mark 6:6, NRSV - And he was amazed at their unbelief. Then he went about among the villages teaching.

Mark 6:6, YLT - 6 ... Then, <u>he left them</u> to go to the other villages, in a circle, teaching.
